Summer Research Student – Division of Vascular Surgery

The Division of Vascular Surgery is looking for an **MD student** interested in the fields of vascular surgery, vascular medicine, emergency medicine, and/or healthcare quality improvement for their Summer Research Student position (June to August). This is a volunteer position with the potential for student scholarship. No prior research experience is necessary, but the student should be familiar with Excel. Work hours are flexible and can be determined by the student with approval from the Senior Researcher.

The student will develop research skills including, but not limited to, ethical approval process, data acquisition, statistical analysis, and navigating patient charts and electronic records. The student will work closely with a Senior Vascular Surgery Resident (Dr. Culig) and Vascular Surgeon at the Vancouver General Hospital.

The completed project is anticipated for publication and submission to several national and international conferences, in which the research student may have the opportunity to attend and/or present.
