The MD/PhD seminar series aims to illustrate the relationship that exists between clinical practice and medical research, allowing students to hear about various career tracks and ways to combine clinical and research work. In addition to their research, speakers discuss their experiences and training backgrounds, share advice with prospective clinician-scientists, and give their opinions on career development options for clinician-scientists.

Invited speaker **Dr. John Boyd** is an Associate Professor in the Department of Medicine whose research focuses on sudden organ failure as a result of infection (septic shock). His clinical research includes the discovery that excess administration of intravenous fluid can result in decreased survival for patients with septic shock. Tips for Finding Travel Funding for Conferences or Research Exchanges

UBC MD students may be eligible to apply to the <u>MD Student Travel Award</u> competition run by the FoM Dean's Office, both conference and research exchange travel are eligible. The competition occurs in the fall and operates on a reimbursement basis (i.e. for travel that has already occurred). Additionally, the <u>Medical Undergraduate Society</u> (MUS) usually runs a travel program for UBC MD students in the spring. MD students should have received an email from the MUS VP Academic earlier this week with details for the 2017 competition.

In addition to the general <u>tips for finding funding</u> available on the MD & Undergraduate Student Research website, here are some more tips specific to finding travel funding:

- Many agencies only run travel competitions one or twice per year (and you need to apply prior to travel) so start looking early.
- Ask your Department/Division/Centre/Research Group if they sponsor any travel awards some do but they aren't always effectively advertised.
- Check if the conferences you plan to attend offer a travel award. Some conferences may also offer a partial refund of registration fees if you become a member of a related society or volunteer at the conference (e.g. to assist with AV or registration).
- Check if the societies/journals/etc. affiliated with your conference offer any travel awards.
- Make a list of the major societies, journals, foundations, funding agencies etc. in your area of research. Think both specific and broad – e.g. if you were studying the physiological mechanisms of diabetes you could look at the Canadian Diabetes Association (specific), and the Physiological Society (broad). If you aren't sure where to start ask your supervisor and/or other researchers in your group (residents, graduate students, etc.) for suggestions. You may also want to conduct a general prospecting search to see if you can come up with additional agencies to add to your list – e.g. search keywords, research topics etc. (Diabetes charity, Diabetes foundation, Physiology societies, diabetes funding, etc.).
- Once you have a list of potential agencies search their websites for appropriate funding competitions. Look in sections such as "Research", "Fellowships", "Students/Trainees", "Funding", "Grants", etc.
- If you are travelling for a research exchange check if your host institution offers funding for incoming students. Additionally, ensure that you include local agencies/institutions on your list when doing any online prospecting.
