UBC Faculty of Medicine Summer Student Research Program (SSRP)

Deadline: February 10, 2012

The Summer Student Research Program (SSRP) is a competition open to first and second year MD undergraduate students and all non-MD undergraduate students registered at UBC. It provides funding for a two-month summer research project supervised by a member of the Faculty of Medicine. Applications are accepted for hypothesis-driven research projects in all areas of biomedical health research. Applications are submitted by student-supervisor teams and thus students are not required to come up with their own project idea. Due to funding limitations, not all students who apply are funded. On average the program is able to support approximately 40 MD students and 30 non-MD students.

MD students receive a stipend of \$3,200 for two months of full time work while non-MD students receive a stipend of \$2,800. Factsheets outlining the program basics are available for MD undergraduate students, non-MD undergraduate students and potential supervisors.

Canadian Cystic Fibrosis Foundation Summer Studentship

Deadline: February 1, 2012

Cystic Fibrosis Canada Summer Studentships are intended to provide support to students engaged in 3-month summer research projects in areas of the biomedical or behavioural sciences relevant to cystic fibrosis, normally under the direction of CF clinic directors or principal investigators based at a Canadian host institution. The proposed supervisor need not be in receipt of a Cystic Fibrosis Canada grant.

Full-time students pursuing an undergraduate degree in an appropriate discipline are eligible to receive this award. Note that applications must be made by the proposed supervisor on behalf of a student. Applications directly from students cannot be accepted.
