<u>American Association of Neurological Surgeons Medical Student Summer Research Fellowship</u>

Deadline: February 1, 2012

The AANS through the Neurosurgery Research and Education Foundation is offering the AANS Medical Student Summer Research Fellowship program. The fellowship is open to **MD students** in the US or Canada who have completed 1-2 years of medical school and wish to spend a summer working in a neurosurgical laboratory, being mentored by a member of the AANS. MD/PhD students are not eligible. Awards of \$2,500 are provided for a minimum 2-month research project.

Associated Medical Services Inc., Hannah Studentship

Deadline: February 1, 2012

In partnership with the Canadian Society for the History of Medicine, studentships of \$5,500 are available to undergraduate students (both MD and non-MD) registered in a Canadian University to conduct a 3-month project in the history of medicine (broadly defined as the history of health, disease or medicine).

SIR Foundation Student Research Grant

Deadline: February 1, 2012

The Student Research Grant is designed to foster an interest in research by funding a summer research project conducted by a student in an area identified by SIR Foundation as important to the advancement of interventional radiology and patient care. Awards of up to \$4,000 are available to **undergraduate students (MD and non-MD)** in both Canada and the United States.

Stem Cell Network Undergraduate Research Training Award

Deadline: February 1, 2012

The intent of this award is to enable **undergraduate students (MD and non-MD)** to obtain experience in stem cell research under the supervision of a Stem Cell Network (SCN) Principal Investigator. Furthermore, attendance at the Network Annual General Meeting will provide students with the opportunity to further their knowledge in the stem cell field, to network with the Canadian stem cell research community and to further their presentation skills. Provides up to \$10,000 for an undergraduate student to work on a research project for up to 8 months (2 four-month terms) with clear relevance to stem cells.

Radiological Society of North America (RSNA) Medical Student Grant

Deadline: February 1, 2012

The award aims to increase the opportunities for **MD students** to have a research experience in medical imaging and to encourage them to consider academic radiology as an important option for their future. Recipients will gain experience in defining objectives, developing research skills and testing hypotheses before making their final choices for residency training programs. Students are expected to undertake a research project requiring full time efforts for at least 10 weeks under the guidance of a scientific advisor during personal/vacation time or during a research elective approved by their medical school. Awards of up to \$6,000 are available (\$3,000 from RSNA and \$3,000 to be provided by the project supervisor).

The Eye Foundation of Canada Summer Scholarship Program

Deadline: February 7, 2012

The program is open to both first and second year **MD students** who intend on pursuing a career in ophthalmology. The program allows students to spend the summer furthering their education in ophthalmic medicine, surgery and research. The program encompasses all subspecialty areas in ophthalmology. Each student will become involved in at least one research project that is supported by the Foundation. Awards of up to \$8,000 are available.
