Kloshe Tillicum CIHR-IAPH Aboriginal Health Research Awards

Deadline: January 2, 2013

Kloshe Tillicum, one of nine Network Environments for Aboriginal Health Research (NEAHR) in Canada was developed through the Canadian Institutes of Health Research—Institute of Aboriginal Peoples Health (CIHR-IAPH) network initiative to improve health for all Aboriginal peoples. By creating gathering spaces for researchers and communities, building community capacity in Aboriginal health research, as well as providing Aboriginal health research scholarships to students, Kloshe Tillicum is working towards this goal in British Columbia (BC) and the Yukon Territory (YT). There are two types of Aboriginal health research training opportunities:

**Clinician Research Mentorship Opportunity** – Up to 3 awards (\$3,000 each) are available to medical students, family practice residents, specialty residents (and other students in health care professions) who are interested in Aboriginal health research and who are enrolled in a degree program.

**Undergraduate Aboriginal Health Research Training Opportunity** – Up to 3 awards (\$3,000 each) are available to undergraduate students with an interest in Aboriginal health research enrolled in year 3 or 4 of a degree program.

#### **AANS Medical Student Summer Research Fellowship**

Deadline: February 1, 2013

The American Association of Neurological Surgeons (AANS) through the Neurosurgery Research and Education Foundation is offering the AANS Medical Student Summer Research Fellowship (MSSRF) program. Twenty (20) Fellowships in the amount of \$2,500 will be awarded to medical students in the United States or Canada who have completed one or two years of medical school and wish to spend a summer working in a neurosurgical laboratory, mentored by a neurosurgical investigator who is a member of the AANS and will sponsor the student.

Medical Tourism in South Asia: Moving From Brain Drain to Brain Gain

Date: Monday, November 19, 2012; 5:00 - 6:30 PM

Location: Coach House, Green College (6201 Cecil Green Park Road), UBC

With the 2012 global turnover expected to reach \$100-billion USD, medical tourism (travel across international borders to obtain health care) is rapidly expanding. India and Thailand are currently the

lead global service suppliers. Unfortunately, providing health care to tourists may exacerbate the already critical shortages of health professionals in these countries' underserved sectors—in remote rural areas and in the public sector. What can be done to improve the impact of medical tourism on health worker availability in these sectors? State regulation of medical tourism might increase prices and send tourists to competitors. International regulation and codes tend to be toothless. Speaker Nir Eyal (Global Health and Social Medicine, Harvard Medical School) proposes an ethical accreditation system that might improve health worker availability at an acceptable cost. Accreditation could promote global health in additional areas. This academic event hosted by Green College is open to the University community and general public without charge.
