### **Brain Tumour Foundation of Canada Research Studentships** Deadline: January 25, 2013; Note that applications must be <u>mailed</u>

Brain Tumour Foundation of Canada is pleased to announce the launch of a new research studentship program that is open to both **second-year undergraduate science students** pursuing an Honours Bachelor of Science degree and to **first-year medical students** interested in becoming more familiar with the Brain Tumour Research Field and its research methods. Applications are considered for brain tumour research that is Basic, Clinical or Translational in nature. All research focuses will be given serious consideration, including projects that focus on pediatric brain tumours. SCN Undergraduate Research Training Award Deadline: March 1, 2013

The intent of this award is to provide **undergraduate students** (non-MD) and co-op students the opportunity to obtain significant hands-on experience in stem cell research through work placements in the laboratories of Stem Cell Network (SCN) Researchers. The SCN Undergraduate Research

Training/Co-op awards provides \$10,000 in salary support for an undergraduate/ co-op student to work on a stem cell-focused research project in the lab of a SCN PI over two four-month work terms (which may be contiguous). In addition, the SCN Undergraduate Research Training/Co-op awards also covers the travel and accommodation costs for the student to present their research at a subsequent Till & McCulloch Meeting (TMM) that overlaps or immediately follows the term of this award. Applicants must be working towards their undergraduate degree at a Canadian university enrolled in either an undergraduate or co-operative education program for the entire duration of their first work term. Awardees cannot be enrolled in a graduate program at any point while holding this award. Candidates' proposed supervisors for the work term placement must be SCN Principal Investigators (PIs) – a list of current SCN PIs is available on the website (hyperlinked above) Note: An SCN PI can host an undergraduate/co-op student from a different institution other than his/her own.
