The Council of State Neurosurgical Societies (CSNS) and Congress of Neurological Surgeons (CNS) Medical Student Socioeconomic Fellowship provides \$2,500 to support a **medical student** conducting research on a socioeconomic issue impacting neurosurgical practice. The awardee will spend 8-10 weeks conducting research on a socioeconomic topic of importance to neurosurgery. This award is open to medical students in the United States and Canada. The Urso Summer Student Program in PSP Research supports **undergraduate**, **graduate** and **medical students** to pursue research focused on progressive supranuclear palsy in the hope of making PSP a long-term area of research interest. Projects may be in basic, translational, clinical or epidemiological aspects of PSP and must be performed under the supervision of a faculty mentor with expertise in the field.

Awards of up to \$3,000 will be provided for stipend and/or research related expenses. Awardees will present the results of their research at the Annual fall CurePSP Research Symposium.
