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Funding Opportunities and Awards

BTFC Brain Tumour Research Studentship

Deadline: Jan 26, 2019, 4:00PM

This Brain Tumour Foundation of Canada (BTFC) studentship program has been developed to accelerate brain tumour research and encourage new, young researchers to join the field. This award is open to **first year medical students AND BSc undergraduate students** in years 1 – 3 attending a Canadian university and working on projects to be performed in Canada. The application must be submitted in two parts: online and **by mail**. Successful applicants are provided a stipend of \$10,000 for two summers (\$5,000 per year). All awardees are required to submit a report by the end of the first summer, and again once their project is complete, to the Brain Tumour Foundation of Canada.

Canadian Foundation for Infectious Diseases AMMI Canada Medical Student Research Award

Deadline: Jan 29, 2019

This award provides support for **medical students** conducting research in infectious diseases and microbiology. Applicants must be enrolled in an undergraduate medical program in a Canadian university and be in good standing. The student's research supervisor must also be a member in good standing of the Association of Medical Microbiology and Infectious Disease (AMMI) Canada, and the research area must be relevant to the diagnosis, treatment, or prevention of infectious diseases. Successful applicants will receive an award of \$4,000 for an 8-10 week research term that is performed consecutively over the summer, or intermittently over the course of one academic year. Awardees are encouraged to submit a poster or oral presentation on their work to the annual AMMI Canada meeting.

Canadian Frailty Network Summer Studentship

Deadline: Jan 29, 2019 - Indication of Intent, Feb 12, 2019 - Application

The Canadian Frailty Network offers awards of up \$4000 to Canadian **MD** and non-MD undergraduates to conduct research related to improving healthcare for older Canadians living with frailty. Awards must be matched by the student's supervisor. Students must have completed their first year of study. **Note that applicants must submit an Indication of Intent by January 29.** The full application is due February 12. 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Canadian Foundation for Infectious Diseases Undergraduate Summer Research Awards

Deadline: Jan 29, 2019

The Canadian Foundation for Infectious Diseases (CFID) Undergraduate Summer Research Awards are open to **undergraduate students** who intend to research areas relevant to the diagnosis, treatment, or prevention of infectious diseases. Students are required to have a minimum GPA of B+ (3.33 or 76%) and be in **2nd year or higher**. Awardees will receive \$4,000 for a 12-13 week research term, either as a summer research project, an elective research term, or a co-op work term. Awardees are required to submit a summary report after the completion of their project, and are encouraged to submit a paper or oral presentation at the AMMI Canada annual meeting.

CurePSP Urso Summer Student Fellowships (for Research on Progressive Supranuclear Palsy)

Deadline: Jan 31, 2019

CurePSP's Usro Summer Student Fellowships provides awards of up to \$3000 to support **MD or non-MD undergraduate** students conducting summer research projects focused on progressive supranuclear palsy (PSP). Projects may be in basic, translational, clinical, or epidemiological aspects of PSP, and must be supervised by a faculty mentor with expertise. Awardees are expected to present their research at the CurePSP Research Symposium.

Canadian Association of Gastroenterology Summer Studentship Awards

Deadline: Jan 31, 2019

The Canadian Association of Gastroenterology (CAG) is pleased to announce the availability of its Summer Student Scholarships for *undergraduate students*. Note that students who have completed an undergraduate degree, or will graduate before undertaking, or during this award, are not eligible. Successful applicants will be awarded a stipend of \$5,000 for full time work on a research project for 4 months (May to August). An additional \$1,000 will be awarded to the top ranked applicant for the Ivan Beck Memorial Summer Studentship Applicants must identify a supervisor who is a CAG member of good standing for at least three years.
