Year 3 Research Scholarships: Call for Applications

Application deadline: Sept 26th, 2023

Applications are now being accepted for merit-based scholarships for Year 3 MD students involved in research. Full eligibility requirements and application guidelines are available by following the link below to the online application form. Students must be in good academic standing and currently registered in Year 3 of the MD undergraduate program; students on leave are not eligible to apply. MD/PhD students must be in Year 3 of the MD curriculum (i.e. clerkship, not a thesis year) to be eligible for this competition. MD/PhD students who previously applied to this competition due to different eligibility requirements in past years are not eligible to re-apply for these awards. The expectation is that applicants will have considerable research experience in the field applicable to the scholarship(s) for which they are applying. MD Undergraduate Student Travel Award Competition: Call for Applications (MD 2024-2026s only)

Application deadline: Sept 29th, 2023

The MD Student Travel Award Competition is now accepting applications (from MD 2024-2026s only). This competition is for travel expenses related to participation in an official online or in-person conference or symposium at which the student presents a paper or poster.

This competition is run on a reimbursement basis (i.e. expenses must have already been incurred) and is to assist with expenses that occurred from September 1, 2022 – August 31, 2023.

Awards of up to \$500 will be granted to help cover eligible travel expenses (as defined on the website linked above). All travel expenses must conform to <u>UBC travel policies</u>. Students can submit expenses for > 1 conference/research exchange if their expenses for a single trip total less than \$500.

Earl W. Davie Symposium 2023

This annual 1-day symposium honours Dr. Earl W. Davie's scientific contributions in hemostasis-thrombosis, which have impacted on the care of patients world-wide. He and his colleagues devised the revolutionary Waterfall Sequence for Blood Clotting, and subsequently, throughout the 1960s and '70s, applied cutting edge technologies to identify and characterize most of the coagulation proteins and their genes. For his many remarkable achievements, Dr. Davie, a Professor of Biochemistry at the University of Washington in Seattle, was widely acclaimed, receiving numerous awards, including investiture as a member of the US National Academy of Science. He was a wonderful teacher and mentor, and he left a legacy that will be felt for many generations.
